Legal Writing 3 and Legal Writing 4

Day Division students are required to take Legal Writing 3 and Legal Writing 4 during their second year. **Legal Writing 3** provides an introduction to researching and writing about non-litigation transactional issues and documents, with additional emphasis on oral communication with colleagues and clients. All sections of Legal Writing 3 are offered as General Practice sections. **Legal Writing 4** focuses on advanced research and writing skills in a variety of doctrinal areas and on creating legal instruments common to these areas. All second-year Day Division students were required to take Legal Writing 3 in the Fall semester, except for those who took a Legal Writing 4 Equivalency Class (e.g., certain Law Review students). Students who took an Equivalency Class in the Fall, and deferred Legal Writing 3, must register for Legal Writing 3 in the Spring semester. All other second-year Day Division students must register for Legal Writing 4 in the Spring semester.

ADR IN THE WORKPLACE (2 credits) - Prof. Malin

Class will meet in person for approximately 21 hours during the week (the hours will vary depending on the day, and there will be no in-person class session on Wednesday), with approximately 5 hours of additional instruction through distance learning techniques. If you enroll in the course and later decide not to take it, you must drop it no later than Monday, December 21, or you will be charged full tuition for the course unless another student takes your seat. Priority for this class will be given to students seeking the Labor and Employment Law Certificate.

WHAT EVERY LAWYER SHOULD KNOW ABOUT BUSINESS (1 credit)

This class will provide students with a basic introduction to some of the most important legal and financial subjects that affect businesses, including different types of business entities, securities laws, business ethics, accounting, bankruptcy, tax, and mergers and acquisitions. Different subjects will be taught by different professors who specialize in the area. The goal of the course is to provide students with basic literacy in these topics. We believe this is important, as almost every legal practitioner will encounter these issues and should have some familiarity with them. The course is designed for students who would not otherwise enroll in many business-related courses, as well as for students who would like a birds-eye overview of these subjects before studying them in detail. Classes will meet 10:00 a.m.-12:00 noon and 1:00 p.m. - 3:00 p.m. each day. A multiple-choice exam will be given on Friday, January 15.
