Evidence and the Art of Advocacy:

This course consists of taking Evidence and the Art of Advocacy (a special section of Evidence) and Trial Advocacy 1 concurrently. Enrollment is limited. You will receive a total of six credits and will receive one grade for the entire six credits. Pass/fail is not available. If you have already taken Evidence, you may not take this course. **Students should register for both Evidence and the Art of Advocacy and the Trial Advocacy 1 section listed below.** The course is designed for students who wish to be trial lawyers. It will give students a mastery of the rules of evidence while also learning the practical application of those rules in the courtroom. You will apply the rules of evidence as they are discussed each week in class in your Trial Advocacy sections that same week. There will be an Evidence final, a midterm bench trial, and a final jury trial.

*Pass/fail only. Prerequisite: Civil Procedure is the only prerequisite. Instructor permission is required to register for the 1-credit version. For the 1-hour version, students are required to perform 10 hours a week of fieldwork and there is no classroom component. Students are required to perform 17 hours a week of fieldwork for the 3-credit version and 21 hours a week of fieldwork for the 4-credit version, in addition to the classroom component. INTERSESSION COURSE

STRATEGIC PROBLEM-SOLVING AND THE LAW (3 credits)

Profs. Johnson and Baker

Pass/fail only. This course will immerse students in complex, contemporary legal problems that demand creative, sophisticated analysis and prompt action. Working entirely in groups, students will delve into different subject areas, including employment relationships, environmental law, human rights and relational contracts. Each of the four problems that we work on will include intensive, practical research training; in particular, the course will be covering free, practice-related research, government document research, international law and business research. The course aims to simulate decision-making challenges that you often don't face in law school, but frequently face in the real world. Students will produce several kinds of written work product, including client letters, informal inter-agency memos, corporate policy papers, and negotiation outlines. Students will also give oral group presentations to a "client," a "commissioner," and an "executive board." You will be expected to be available at school from 8:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. each day except Friday (when we will end by 4 p.m.), and there will be additional work to be done at home in the evening and over the weekend prior to the beginning of class. If you enroll in the course and later decide not to take it, you must drop it no later than Wednesday, May 11, or you will be charged full tuition for the course unless another student takes your seat. Priority for this class will be given to students seeking the Praxis Certificate. First-year students are welcome to take this class, but they should be aware that it requires a lot of work directly after they have finished their exams. You may take a regular Summer load of up to 6 credits in addition to this class. Contact Jenna Abhijeet to have your Summer maximum credits increased if needed.

CLINICAL EDUCATION COURSES

Permission is required for admission to all clinical programs. All In-house and Externship clinical programs are graded on a pass/low pass/fail basis only. Students are expected to put in a minimum of 224 hours (an average of 32 hours a week for 7 weeks) for 4-credit In-House Clinics and for Externships (in addition to the classroom component), and a minimum of 168 hours (an average of 24 hours a week for 7 weeks) for 3-credit In-House Clinics. Students must be available at the days and times designated below to meet with supervising attorneys and at other times as required by the supervising attorneys.
