Legislation

Second-year students in the **part-time Day Division** should register for Legislation (see previous page).

Legal Writing 3 and Legal Writing 4

Day Division students are required to take Legal Writing 3 and Legal Writing 4 during their second year. **Legal Writing 3** provides an introduction to researching and writing about non-litigation transactional issues and documents, with additional emphasis on oral communication with colleagues and clients. All sections of Legal Writing 3 are offered as General Practice sections. **Legal Writing 4** focuses on advanced research and writing skills in a variety of doctrinal areas and on creating legal instruments common to these areas. All second-year Day Division students were required to take Legal Writing 3 in the Fall semester, except for those who took a Legal Writing 4 Equivalency Class (e.g., certain Law Review students). Students who took an Equivalency Class in the Fall, and deferred Legal Writing 3, must register for Legal Writing 3 in the Spring semester. All other second-year Day Division students must register for Legal Writing 4 in the Spring semester.

Legal Writing 3 is *not* a prerequisite for taking Legal Writing 4; Evening Division students may take the courses in either order.

ADR IN THE WORKPLACE (2 credits)

Prof. Malin

Pass/fail not available. This intensive class explores the doctrine and process of labor arbitration, employment mediation and employment arbitration. Students will participate in selecting neutral arbitrators, prepping for and conducting labor arbitrations, an employment mediation and an employment arbitration. There will be comments, critiques and suggestions at every step along the way. The condensed schedule should help you focus on mediation and arbitration as you would in real life. Class will meet in person for approximately 21 hours during the week (the hours will vary depending on the day, and there will be no in-person class session on Wednesday), with approximately 6 hours of additional instruction through distance learning techniques. If you enroll in the course and later decide not to take it, you must drop it no later than Monday, December 18, or you will be charged full tuition for the course. Priority for this class will be given to students seeking the Labor and Employment Law Certificate.

DESIGN LAW (2 credits)

Prof. Carani

This class will meet from 9:00-12:00 and 1:00-4:00 each day, except Friday, when it will meet only 9:00-12:00. There will be an exam early in the Spring semester. *Course description:* The case of Apple v. Samsung, which largely regarded the aesthetic appearance of smart phones and tablets (including related GUI's), thrust design rights into the lime light. Consumer demand good design, and product manufacturers are investing record amounts to capture eye appeal. In the age of online-market places, where consumers can't touch and feel a product, the appearance of a product is often pivotal in the consumer's purchasing decision. Increasingly the aesthetic appearance of products is a leading driver of sales. All of this interest begs the question: How are product appearances protected and enforced under existing intellectual property laws? This class seeks to provide an overview of the various intellectual rights used to protect appearance, including design patents, trade dress, and copyright law. The class will include discussion of the statutory and judicial underpinnings and requirements of each of those rights, including discussions of the key cases regarding validity and infringement. The course will also discuss international framework for design protection, strategic aspects of design portfolio management, including tips for design patent applications and the use of design patents in combination with trademarks, and copyrights to achieve best results.

STRATEGIC PROBLEM-SOLVING AND THE LAW (2 or 3 credits)

Profs. Baker and Johnson

Pass/fail only. This course will immerse students in complex, contemporary legal problems that demand creative, sophisticated analysis and prompt action. Working entirely in groups, students will delve into different subject areas, including employment relationships, environmental law, consumer rights and relational contracts. Each of the four problems that we work on will include intensive, practical research training; in particular, the course will be covering free, practice-related research, government document research, international law and business research. The course aims to simulate decision-making challenges that you often don't face in law school, but frequently face in the real world. Students will produce several kinds of written work product, including client letters, informal inter-agency memos, corporate policy papers, and negotiation outlines. Students will also give oral group presentations to a "client," a "commissioner," and an "executive board." You will be expected to be available at school from 8:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. each day except Friday (when we will end by 4:00 p.m.). There will be additional work over the weekend prior to the beginning of class and a good deal of work in the evenings as well. Due to recent ABA regulations, we can now only offer the class for 2 credits unless students are willing to do supplemental reading and write short paper. Satisfactory completion of the paper, which will be due 4 weeks into the semester and will also be graded pass/fail, is required in order to earn a third credit. If you enroll in the course and later decide not to take it, you must drop it no later than January 3 at 3:00 p.m. or you will be charged full tuition for the course unless another student takes your seat. Priority for this class will be given to students seeking the Praxis Certificate.
