Introduction to the UCC. p.1 (Part (A)); 4-14. **Omit** Note (C)(4) (p.6) & part (E) (8-10).

Credit; rights of unsecured creditors; rights of sellers to recover goods sold on credit. 15-26. **Omit** parts (A) & (B) (22-23) & Problem 6.

Basic conveyancing principles for goods. 27-40: Problem 1 & Notes (1), (3) & (5) **only**. We will cover the remainder of this material in the following class (Friday, May 31).
