**Credit hour limits and course fee:** With the exceptions noted below, students may take a maximum of **6 credit hours** in the Summer term; there is no minimum. Students who register for 4 credits of In-House Clinic or Externship courses may take a total of 7 credits with the permission of Prof. Richard Gonzalez. Students taking an intersession class (see next page) may take a regular Summer load of up to 6 credits in addition to the intersession class. Any student taking more than 6 credits under one of these exceptions should contact Dean Sowle so that your maximum credit limit can be adjusted in the registration system. A **course fee** of \$350, in addition to regular tuition, will be charged to full-time students for regular classroom courses taken during the Summer term, including any courses taken through our exchange programs with DePaul, Loyola, John Marshall, and including classes taken through other ABA-accredited schools. The fee does **not** apply to part-time students; it also does not apply (for any student) to clinical courses, externships, or Independent Research credits pursued at Chicago-Kent; and it does not apply to courses taken through Chicago-Kent exchange programs with universities abroad. If you qualify for financial aid loans, those can be used to cover the cost of the fee. **See the Registration Bulletin for credit requirements and other information relating to federal and private financial aid loans for the Summer term.**

*This is a specialized section of Evidence; you may not take this course if you have taken, or plan to take, the regular Evidence course. This course is designed to present evidence from the perspective of a trial lawyer and is aimed at students who plan a careers in criminal or civil litigation. The material will cover a traditional evidence curriculum while demonstrating how the rules are actually used and argued in the adversarial process. It will be an interactive class in which students will spend a great deal of time on their feet solving evidentiary problems, arguing opposing sides, while mastering the rules. Preference will be given to students newly-accepted onto Trial Team. Note: If you register for this course, you will be required to register for the Intensive Trial Advocacy 1 class in August (registration for that class will take place as part of Fall 2019 registration).

For the one-credit version, there is no classroom component, and instructor permission is required (email Prof. Harley at [kharley@kentlaw.iit.edu](mailto:kharley@kentlaw.iit.edu) for permission). For the one-credit version, students must perform 10 hours a week of fieldwork and there is no classroom component. Students must perform 17 hours a week of fieldwork for the three-credit version and 21 hours a week of fieldwork for the four-credit version, in addition to the classroom component.

## **INTERSESSION COURSES**

### **SOFTWARE PATENTS: A PRACTICAL PERSPECTIVE** (2 credits)

Prof. Sutton

Classes will meet from 9:00-12:00 noon and 2:00-5:00 p.m. each day. This course does not require a background in software or patent law. *Course description:* In this course, we will discuss the most recent patent laws that have the most significant effects on software innovators, software businesses, and software patent trolls. Students will learn to analyze software-related patents, especially patent claims, to make reasoned judgments with respect to patent infringement and patent validity. This course provides a particular focus on patentable subject matter issues, divided infringement issues, and indefiniteness issues that may arise during this analysis. Students will also learn to make suggestions for improving software patent claims to reduce risks of non-infringement and invalidity while still capturing the core innovation. Students may take a regular Summer load of up to 6 credits in addition to this class. Contact Dean Sowle to have your Summer maximum credits increased if needed.

## CLINICAL EDUCATION COURSES

Permission is required for admission to all clinical programs. All In-house and Externship clinical programs are graded on a pass/low pass/fail basis only. Students are expected to put in a minimum of 224 hours (an average of 32 hours a week for 7 weeks) for 4-credit In-House Clinics and for Externships (in addition to the classroom component), and a minimum of 168 hours (an average of 24 hours a week for 7 weeks) for 3-credit In-House Clinics (in addition to the classroom component). Students must be available at the days and times designated below to meet with supervising attorneys and at other times as required by the supervising attorneys.
