Legal Writing 3

Second-year Day Division students must register for Legal Writing 3 in the Fall semester, unless you qualify to take a Legal Writing 4 Equivalency Class (see below). Legal Writing 3 provides an introduction to researching and writing about non-litigation transactional issues and documents, with additional emphasis on oral communication with colleagues and clients. All sections of Legal Writing 3 are offered as General Practice sections. In the Spring semester, you will take Legal Writing 4, which focuses on advanced research and writing skills in a variety of doctrinal areas and on creating legal instruments common to these areas. **Note:** Additional sections of Legal Writing 3 are listed on the Evening Division schedule.

Legal Writing 4 Equivalency Classes

PUBLIC INTEREST HOUSING LAW WORKSHOP (3 credits) - Prof. Atuahene

Course number: 349-01

Monday, August 17 - Saturday, August 22

Format: Online

The class will meet online from 9:00 am to -3:00 pm each day. The class will address the property tax foreclosure crisis in Detroit. One in four Detroit properties have been subject to property tax foreclosure. More troubling, the City assessed the majority of Detroit homes at rates that violated the Michigan Constitution, placing the unprecedented number of property tax foreclosures in disrepute. Working collaboratively with the Coalition for Property Tax Justice and its partner organizations, students will spend the week working to end the property tax foreclosure crisis in Detroit and learning about housing injustice in America.
